The first edition of the Code of Practice for Turret Clock Work came into effect on 19th May 2018 after wide consultation with those concerned with the repair and conservation of turret clocks in the United Kingdom.

For technical reasons it may occasionally be necessary to slightly deviate from the Code of Practice in the best interests of the clock. In which case a confidential second opinion should be obtained from the Turret Clock Advisory Panel who will give guidance.
